Don't Use Slang or Figures of Speech . As dementia progresses, it can become harder for someone to understand what you're trying to tell them.For example, telling a loved one with Alzheimer's disease that it's "no use crying over spilled milk" might result in him looking to see where the milk has spilled, rather than end up comforting him or encouraging him not to focus on a past problem.
