Example of a Basic Quantitative Trading System. Stock is trading above its 50-day simple moving average. Stock's 20-day moving average is above stock's 50-day moving average. Stock's Average Directional Index (ADX) is above 25. Stock is trading within 5% of its 52-week high.

As an example, there might be an obscure trading strategy, which, every 5 years chooses one new stock to invest into. Now, if this inherently random strategy would happen to once invest into a stock that increases 100-fold over the five year period, it is quite likely, that the strategy's return/risk and t-stat would look great.
